The Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center (HSLIC) manages the Domenici Center for Health Sciences Education. We schedule space and help faculty use the technology.

About the Center

The Domenici Center complex contains more than 100,000 square feet designed for a variety of Health Sciences Center (HSC) student and administrative uses. Student education is the first priority for the building.

Plenty of areas are also available for relaxing and studying, including the student lounge located east of the auditorium, balconies and patios throughout the building, the outdoor seating area and Canyon Garden.

Phase III Coming Soon

In June 2015, New Mexico Gov. Susana Martinez signed a capital outlay bill that provides funding for construction of Phase III. This final phase will add 65,000 square feet of large classrooms for active learning, laboratories, simulation and student study space to support the Colleges of Nursing and Pharmacy and the School of Medicine. It is scheduled to be completed in 2017.
