

Importing References from Google Scholar to EndNote

1. Go to Google Scholar (<http://scholar.google.com/schhp?hl=en&tab=ws>)
2. Click on *Scholar Preferences* to the right of the Search button.
3. Scroll to the bottom to the Bibliography Manager section. Click on the second button entitled “*Show links to import citations into*” and select EndNote.
4. Then click on *Save Preferences* in the lower right corner of the Preferences screen.
5. Conduct your search in Google Scholar.
6. When you find an article you wish to add to EndNote, click on the link entitled “*Import into EndNote*”.
7. In the dialog box that appears, click on Save.
8. Save the file to your Desktop.
9. Go into EndNote.
10. Click on *Import* under the *File* pull down menu.
11. In the Import File box, click on *Choose...* and find your file on the Desktop – it should be named **scholar.enw**.
12. In the Import Option box, select *EndNote Import*.
13. Choose how you want to deal with duplicates in the next box.
14. Then click *Import*.
15. You will have to follow these steps for each article you want to save from Google Scholar.
