Research, Teaching and Service Interests

Professional Statement

My interests include teaching graduate and undergraduate students to more effectively locate, critically evaluate and use information for patient care and research purposes. My approach to teaching is student-centered and interactive. I have found using case or assignment-based scenarios makes the content more relevant to the learner thus generating more interest in the subject matter. My professional goal is to continue creating new and interesting ways to incorporate information/research skills into health sciences curricula. In order to improve both my content and teaching methodologies I attend education seminars and workshops. I recently completed the UNM SOM Medical Education Scholars Program (2014-2016).

Teaching

As a librarian educator my experiences include instructing and facilitating group sessions within the SOM curriculum (i.e., Health Equity and Transitions Blocks), individual consults with faculty, staff and students, and presentations to various residency programs. I have received uniformly positive evaluations of my teaching from learners and faculty. I work with library colleagues to incorporate both librarianship and health sciences domains into my teaching. I co-designed and have taught three Perspectives in Medicine (PIM) electives for the School of Medicine (*Information Survival Skills; Art & Science of Searching; Considerations in Caring for the Physically Disabled Patient*), a continuing education course for HSC faculty (*Navigating the Information Maze*) and a four hour instructional module within the Pharm 770 Drug Information Rotation. These activities have resulted in published articles, posters, and paper presentations.

Research

My current research focus, information literacy skills measurement in graduate medical education, is a result of my doctoral work in education psychology. Results from my 2014 doctoral study, *Initial Development of the Medical Information Literacy Questionnaire (MILQ)*, indicate good internal reliability however further testing of the revised instrument is the essential next step in the development process. I envision this as the basis of future scholarly projects including eventual testing of the instrument in GME programs nationally.

Service

I have been engaged in extensive service activities at the UNM Health Sciences Center, many of which encompass a function of assessment. Most rewarding has been my involvement on the Graduate Medical Education Internal Review committee. As a faculty reviewer for residency and fellowship programs at UNM I have contributed to reports pointing out program strengths and areas needing improvement. I also have worked with medical students and the SOM Office of Program, Education, Assessment and Research (PEAR) on several CQI block reviews and am a member of the HSLIC Assessment Team. As a member of the LCME Self Study Educational Resources Committee (2008-2010 and 2013-present) I had the opportunity to research and report on a wide range of educational resources necessary to provide a well-rounded medical school curriculum. Working on these committees has provided me with a holistic view of the educational process which further informs my teaching and research.

The overall goal of this study is to pilot test a newly developed objective structured clinical examination (OSCE) to assess physicians' chronic pain assessment skills. This OSCE is an educational activity designed to provide formative feedback to licensed physicians about their clinical performance in three (3) standardized patient cases.

Aim 1: Examine test scores for validity evidence.

Aim 2: Set the standard for a passing cut score.

Aim 3: To examine successes and barriers of physician participants eliciting the pain stories in each of the three standardized patient (SP) cases.

UNM IRB #13-83 *Information Literacy in Graduate Medical Education: Instrument Development*

Co-PI with Jay Parkes, Ph.D., doctoral advisor. For this study I constructed a questionnaire of sixty-nine multiple-choice items to assess skills covering five IL domains. Evidence of test content was evaluated by a panel of twenty physicians and five health sciences librarians. A draft instrument was administered to a convenience sample of resident physicians at the University of New Mexico during a two week period in 2014. Psychometric properties of the tested items were evaluated using item analyses. Scores from the pilot test were analyzed to examine the structure of the draft instrument.

The internal consistency reliability coefficient using Cronbach's alpha was good ($\alpha = .872$). Data from the item analyses for each item was used to guide the item retention process. Each item was reviewed for corrected item-total correlation value to gauge level of item discrimination and P-values for item difficulty. Cronbach's alpha-if-item-deleted, CVR scores established by the validity panel, and the test blueprint were also considered. Based on the analyses, 32 items (46%) were eliminated from the original pool of 69 items tested. The remaining 37 items now constitute a revised instrument ($\alpha = .858$). Further testing of the revised instrument is planned as a Medical Education Scholars project.

HRRC#09-100 *Information Literacy in Medicine: a card sort activity*

Co-PI with Jay Parkes, Ph.D. This study was conducted to elicit information from physicians, about the level of importance of information literacy standards in graduate medical education. Using a card sorting method, subject matter experts were invited to categorize and assign weights to content and behavioral objectives of the construct known as information literacy. The results were used to develop a test blueprint that became the eventual framework for an Information Literacy instrument.
